National Stem Cell Foundation Scholars

The National Stem Cell Foundation (NSCF) Scholars Program works to inspire creativity and passion among middle school science teachers, ten of whom are selected each year for this prestigious program. Scholars engage in hands-on, minds-on science activities, connect with speakers and thought leaders in STEM education, learn with skilled science educators, and develop a creative project for classroom implementation. Each class of scholars takes part in a one-week summer workshop at Western Kentucky University and a mid-year meeting. All expenses, including travel costs, materials, mentoring, and project supplies are covered by a grant from the National Stem Cell Foundation.

Little Learners, Big Ideas

The Little Learners, Big Ideas video series teaches educators and parents practical strategies to support curiosity and innovation in early childhood.
